The Illinois Daily Usage and California Honey Lake Stamps

T o meet the increasing demand for public hunting grounds following World War II, many state conservation agencies purchased and developed additional waterfowl management areas. In the 1950s, Illinois and

California required hunters to purchase stamps for these areas.

In Illinois, these "daily usage" stamps were used at various public hunting grounds throughout the state for ducks, geese and pheasants. The earliest recorded example is from 1953. Illinois has issued a daily usage stamp every year to date, except 1973-1976.

The Honey Lake Wildlife area is located in Lassen County of northeastern California. Starting with the 1956-57 waterfowl season, seasonal permits were issued in the form of stamps.

Through 1966-67, the stamps all included a printer's inscription in the bottom right corner specifying the number of stamps printed. However, the demand exceeded the supply in that year, necessitating a small second printing that lacked the inscription. Thereafter, the inscription was permanently left off the stamps.
